What is *justice*?

Fairness or equality

A recognition of a past injury and past injustice

Making right a previous wrong

Backward and forwards looking

Reconciliation

Admitting there was a wrong and moving toward a reconciled present.

Equity: taking into account the past, uneven playing field.

Incredibly contextual: means different things in different locations.

When injured party feels that justice has been righted. Justice is in the purview of power.



What is *environmental* justice?

Taking care of the earth, trying to reduce wastefulness

Environmental laws and who they benefit/affect

Uneven weight of "performing" environmentalism across race/gender

Uneven distribution of environmental impacts of industrialization and resources

When environments are unsafe then justice needs to encompass this.

Personal AND structural, encompassing of all scales of living and being.

Anthropocentric impacts on a global ecology.
